If you're interested in learning more about food and how it can be used as a context for learning across the curriculum, then Good Food Champions is for you.

The first of its kind, and now in its third year of delivery, this year-long, GTCS-accredited course is delivered in partnership by a range of food education experts, and offers you Professional Recognition in Learning for Sustainability (Lfs).



Course aims:

- Explore the journey and heritage of our food 'from soil and sea to plate'; helping you to reconnect with and understand more about what you eat and where it comes from.
- Investigate the use of food as an interdisciplinary context for learning across the curriculum; and how it can add value to key strategies such as the National Performance Framework; Skills for Learning, Life and Work; Learning for Sustainability; Health & Well-being; Developing the Young Workforce; and Better Eating, Better Learning.
- Provide resources, ideas, practical skills, and inspiration from a range of experts to help you confidently deliver food growing, preparation, eating and enterprise activities with your learners.

Good Food Champions is an interactive hands-on course; offering you the opportunity to meet, network, and learn with other participants. You'll engage in online seminars, take part in visits to food producers and manufacturers, and benefit from the input of a range of guest speakers. You'll also hear from local experts and organisations; helping you to set up links in your area to enhance and sustain your own food-related practice and support you in championing food-related learning in your school. The programme is open to all teachers who have gained full registration with the General Teaching Council for Scotland.

The course also includes the opportunity to undertake self-study activities, and share good practice through our dedicated GLOW site.
