Cookies are small text files placed on your computer or device by websites you visit. They are used to improve your experience as a visitor, and make websites function properly or more efficiently.

We want to consistently improve your online experience. And to do that we use analytics cookies to collect anonymous standard internet log information and details of visitor behaviour – the information gathered does not identify you. We use a combination of permanent and session cookies to collect and retain information for varying lengths of time. That way we can monitor which parts of the website are working, and which areas perhaps need improved. We look at things like how many people visit certain pages, or how users are navigating content. In short, cookies help us create a better experience for our visitors.

Of course you are in control of your own experience, so you may delete or block cookies, but it may impact your experience and elements of the website may not work.
