

Scottish Farmhouse Picnic Competition 2022/23



Scottish Borders Countryside Initiative are running a new competition in conjunction Scottish Borders Council. There are separate competitions for P1-3 and P4-7.

Primaries 1 – 3

The class project should be titled “Our Favorite Picnic”

The entry can take whatever format is preferred, a collage, poster, workbook or similar”.

Pupils should draw and annotate their favorite picnic. Extra marks will be awarded for drawings that link the food in the picnic to the farm it was produced on.

For example a ham sandwich: from a pig farm (ham), arable farm (wheat for the bread) and a dairy farm (butter).

There will be 3 finalists in this age group.

Primaries 4-7

The class should invent a variety of sandwiches that they would like to serve at a picnic.

Research: survey the class (or school) to discover the most popular sandwiches

Action: Pull together the results of the survey to identify the ingredients that most people like

Create: Use the information collected to develop some new fillings for your class sandwiches.

Develop: promote each of the new sandwiches, with a description that will encourage people to try it. This should include information on healthy choices, and on sourcing local ingredients.

The project above should be pulled together into one class submission, and we would love to see some photos of the created sandwiches and pupils making and trying them.

There will be 4 finalists in this age group.

How to enter

- » **P1-3:** Each class should submit a set of annotated drawings. Photographs may accompany the entry to show the learning in class
- » **P4-7:** Each class should submit their project, and photographs of the sandwiches and pupils taking part in the project.
- » School, class and the teacher’s name must printed on the entry.
- » **All entries must be sent to borders@rhet.org.uk or Oliverbank East, Tweedsmuir, Biggar, ML12 6QS before 3rd February 2023**
- » Prizes will be presented February/March 2023 (exact date TBA) with representatives from the class being asked to attend
